# **Brevillier Village to Host Nurse Aide Class**



We're excited to announce our partnership with HVA Senior Living Alliance! We already collaborate with them and serve as a clinical site for students enrolled in their nurse aide training program. What's new is that Brevillier will also be hosting the students for their classroom instruction.

Theory and classroom lectures will be held on campus, in Barnabas Court South apartments. Once students complete that portion of their training, they then move to Ball Pavilion and demonstrate their skills learned. They work closely with their instructor and our staff to master the skills needed to provide excellent, compassionate care.

Not only do we welcome students from outside Brevillier, we also reserve a few of these openings so we can send our staff looking to become a CNA (certified nursing assistant). If you see them on campus, be sure to welcome them, you just may be seeing them around soon as a nurse aide once they graduate!

### **Personal Care Accommodations at Barnabas Court**

Barnabas Court provides services for seniors who need help with personal care including hygiene, dressing, medication reminders, and other activities of daily living. Residents receive a wide variety of personal care services that are chosen based on individual need and ability. Barnabas Court North and South offer 24 hour nursing assistance with activities of daily living. A communal dining room offers 21 meals a week and encourages socialization. Additional features include secure buildings, housekeeping, laundry, linen service, recreational, social, and spiritual activities services.





### **Nursing Home Transition Information Session**



Ball Pavilion will be hosting resident/family education sessions which The Department of Human Services Office of Long-Term Living has contracted with PA Council on Independent Living (PCIL) to provide. These education sessions are required to be conducted in each Medical Assistance (MA) enrolled nursing facility across the state. They will supply information about Nursing Home Transition (NHT), including transition services available under the Community Health Choices (CHC) Managed Care program, and other home and community-based programs that support MA participants in their homes and communities, such as the OBRA waiver or Living Independence for the Elderly (LIFE) program.

The overall goal of these sessions is to provide residents and their families with information about alternatives to nursing facility services and care. These sessions are a convenient avenue by which facilities can comply with their responsibilities to their residents' civil right to reside in the least restrictive setting possible.

These presentations are approximately one (1) hour in length and focus on the services and supports that the NHT program can provide to a nursing facility resident facing barriers to moving into the community. They include information about recognizing when to make a referral for NHT, how to access NHT services, what specific services are available, and who provides these services. They also discuss the services and supports that can be provided by the CHC program and other home and community-based programs, such as the OBRA waiver and LIFE program, by providing a nursing home level of services and supports to the person in their home.



### **Medicare Advantage Open Enrollment Period**



The Pennsylvania Department of Aging (PDA) is reminding older adults the annual Medicare Advantage Open Enrollment Period runs now through March 31. During this time, beneficiaries who currently have a Medicare Advantage plan can switch to a different plan or to original Medicare. Contact your local Area Agency on Aging to schedule a personalized counseling session. In Erie County, contact GECAC 1-814-459-4581. ### 2024 Property Tax/Rent Rebate Now Open



The application period for the state's 2024 Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program is now open for eligible Pennsylvanians to begin claiming rebates on property taxes or rent paid last year. Income limits increased again this year to \$46,520 for both homeowners and renters. This is due to a 2023 law supported that calls for adjusting the income limit based on annual increases in the Consumer Price Index. Remember to exclude 50% of Social Security when determining your income. The maximum rebate is \$1,000. The program is open to residents aged 65 years and older; widows and widowers 50 years and older; and people with disabilities 18 years and older.

Remember – you do not need to pay anyone for assistance to apply for the rebates. Apply online at mypath.pa.gov, or contact any of my offices for help.

### **Apply for a Retired Status Vehicle Registration**



Retired Status Vehicle Registration is a discounted vehicle registration processing fee that is available for retired people who meet the requirements. Customers who qualify for Retired Status Registration pay a Retired Person's processing fee instead of the full registration renewal fee. To find out if you qualify for retired status registration, please refer to our "Retired Status Fact Sheet." The appropriate Retired Person's registration fee can be found on the "Bureau of Motor Vehicles Schedule of Fees(opens in a new tab)" form. Check online to see if you qualify! www.PA.gov
